

URS: COURSE ENROLLMENT (FALL 2009)

Course Enrollment Periods:

- Enrollment period for Elective and Physical Education classes: July 20 - 29, 2009
- Enrollment period for First-Year Writing Seminars (FWS): July 30 – August 9, 2009

URS Student Schedule:

All first-year URS students enroll in approximately 15 academic credits and one physical education class. In the Fall semester, you are required to enroll in the following classes, totaling 7 academic credits:

- CRP 1100: The American City (3 credits)
- CRP 1106: URS First-Year Seminar (1 credit)
- ECON 1110 (3 credits)

The AAP Registrar's Office will pre-enroll you in these required courses by July 1, 2009. You will be able to view your schedule by logging into Student Center at studentcenter.cornell.edu.

Based on your schedule of required classes, you should select:

- 1 First-Year Writing Seminar (3 credits);
- 1 Distribution Requirement (3 – 4 credits);
- 1 Elective (3 – 4 credits); and
- 1 Physical Education class.

You cannot drop required classes, so it is important that you select classes they do not conflict with your required classes. You will enroll in these classes over the summer.

Course Enrollment Deadlines:

- The AAP Registrar's Office will enroll you in your required classes (CRP 1100, CRP 1106, and ECON 1110) by July 1, 2009. You cannot drop required courses from your schedule without advisor permission.
- You will enroll in elective classes and Physical Education from July 20 - 29, 2009 using Student Center at studentcenter.cornell.edu. Instructions are available online at <http://newstudents.cornell.edu/first-year/courses/>.
- You will enroll in your First-Year Writing Seminar (FWS) from July 30 – August 9, 2009 using the FWS Ballot at <https://fws.arts.cornell.edu/ballot/index.cfm>. Information is available online at http://www.arts.cornell.edu/knight_institute/.

Course Selection:

You will receive detailed information from your department regarding degree requirements and course selection. You can also review the *Courses of Study* (<http://cuinfo.cornell.edu/Academic/Courses/>) and the *Course & Time Roster* (<http://registrar.sas.cornell.edu/courses/roster/FA09/>) for courses that may interest you and fit in your schedule. You will review your course selection with a faculty advisor during Orientation. After your advisor meeting, you will have an opportunity to make changes to your schedule, if needed.
