Cornell's M.R.P. program is designed to allow students to tailor their curriculum to their individual academic interests. The department measures student achievement by graduates' satisfaction with the program's flexibility and support for their individual academic interests in planning, their preparation for employment in the planning field, and by actual employment metrics.	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">97 percent (58 out of 60 survey respondents) of students who graduated between 2014–17 reported they were satisfied/very satisfied with CRP's flexibility and support for their individual academic interests in planning.80 percent (48 out of 60 survey respondents) of students who graduated between 2014–17 reported being satisfied/very satisfied with their preparation for employment through the M.R.P program.
